**5.2.3 CANCELLATION OF AN ACCESS ORDER (Cont'd)**

- F. When a customer cancels an order for the discontinuance of service, no charges apply for the cancellation.
- G. If the Company misses a service date due to circumstances over which it has direct control (excluding, e.g., acts of God, governmental requirements, work stoppages and civil commotions), the customer may cancel an Access Order without incurring cancellation charges.
- H. If an MBSS, SST or SHNS service order is canceled by the customer prior to the start of service a cancellation charge will apply. The Cancellation charge will be determined as follows: (C)
  - 1. Cancellation Charges for those MBSS, SST or SHNS rate elements with nonrecurring charges will be calculated as set forth in E., preceding. (C)
  - 2. Cancellation Charges for those MBSS, SST or SHNS rate elements without nonrecurring charges will be based on all nonrecoverable costs incurred by the Company in association with the service order up to and including the time of cancellation. Nonrecoverable costs are those costs for which the Company has no foreseeable use should the service be terminated. In addition when the cancellation takes place on or after the Design Layout Report Date (DLRD) the Cancellation Charge will include the sum of the twelve month minimum service period for these rate elements based on the fixed period of the customer's respective Pricing Plan. #### (3) Service Rearrangements

Service rearrangements are changes to existing (installed) services which do not result in either a change in the minimum period requirements or a change in the physical location of the point of termination at a customer designated premises, except as set forth in D.2.b.1., following. Changes, which result in the establishment of new minimum period obligations, are treated as disconnects and starts. Changes in the physical location of the point of termination are treated as moves and are described and charged for as set forth in D., following.

The charge to the customer for the service rearrangements is dependent on whether the change is administrative only in nature or involves actual physical change to the service.

Administrative changes will be made without charge(s) to the customer. Administrative changes are as follows:

- Change of customer name (i.e., the customer of record does not change but rather the customer of record changes its name - e.g., XYZ Company to XYZ Communications),
- Change of customer name as the result of a transfer of use of services,
- Change of customer or customer's end user premises address when the change of address is not a result of a physical relocation of equipment,

##### E. Surcharge for Private Line Transport Service

###### 1. General

In addition to the rates and charges described in 7.1.1.A., there is a monthly Private Line Transport Surcharge that may apply to Private Line Transport Service. The Private Line Transport Surcharge compensates the Company for use of the local exchange network when Private Line Transport Service is connected to a PBX or equivalent device, which is capable of interconnecting the Private Line Transport Service with local exchange service. (T)

The Company will automatically bill the surcharge on each Private Line Transport Service installed irrespective of whether the interconnection capability exists in the customer's premises equipment or in a Centrex-CO type switch unless written certification is received from the customer certifying exemption status as set forth in 2., following. (T)

###### 2. Private Line Transport Surcharge Exemptions

The Private Line Transport Service will be exempted from the surcharge if the customer provides the Company written certification that the Private Line Transport Service termination is one of the following: (T)

- a. An open-end termination in a Company switch of an FX line, including CCSA and CCSA-equivalent ONALs; or (T)
- b. An analog channel termination that is used for radio or television program transmission; or

- c. A termination used for TELEX service; or

    - Private Line Transport Service accessing only Lineside Access and no local exchange lines,
    - Private Line Transport Service between customer points of termination,
    - Private Line Transport Service connecting CCSA or CCSA-type equipment (inter-machine trunks); or
  - f. A termination that the customer certifies to the Company is not connected to a PBX or other device capable of interconnecting the Private Line Transport facility to a local exchange subscriber line. (T)
3. Exemption Certification
- a. Private Line Transport Services which are terminated as set forth in 2., preceding, will be exempted from the Private Line Transport Surcharge if the customer provides the Company with a written notification certifying exemption. Such notification shall be provided by the customer: (T)

    - At such time as the Private Line Transport Service is reterminated to a device not capable of interconnecting to the local exchange network, or

- b. If written certification is not received at the time the Private Line Transport Service is obtained, the surcharge will be applied. Exempt status will become effective on the certification date indicated by the customer, subject to the regulations in 4., following.
- c. The exemption certification is to be provided by the customer ordering the service. ##### B. Termination Liability

Customers with Pricing Plans in service prior to August 12, 1997, will retain a Termination Liability of 15% and the minimum billing level requirement of 80% of the total monthly rates for the service, until the expiration of their existing fixed period.

If a customer chooses to discontinue the entire service or a portion of the service prior to the expiration of the fixed period service, termination charges apply (unless the customer satisfies the conditions specified in the Waiver Policy as set forth in C., following).

The minimum billing level is used to calculate the termination charge. The minimum billing level for Packet Switching, MAS, MegaBit Service (i.e., MegaBit Subscriber, MegaBit IDSL or MegaCentral) and LSS is 100% of the total monthly rates for the rate elements being discontinued. An exception for MegaBit IDSL exists when this service is upgraded to MegaBit Subscriber at the same address of record, the termination charge does not apply. The minimum billing levels for Frame Relay and ATM Cell Relay Service are as follows:

The Optional Minimum Billing Level (OMBL) for Frame Relay Service (FRS) is a plan that gives eligible customers the flexibility to remove and add circuits within Company territory without incurring a Termination Liability Assessment (TLA) as long as they stay at or above their TLA threshold level. Eligible customers who subscribe to this option must designate at the time they subscribe to a fixed period service rate plan which of their FRS recurring revenue will be part of OMBL and which will remain on SMBL. As new FRS is installed, the customer must determine whether to include the new service in the OMBL or SMBL. (T)

A customer may have two or more OMBL fixed period service rate plans in effect at the same time. (T)

• Eligibility Requirements:

- Must have an annual projected FRS revenue of \$100,000 or more that will be committed to each OMBL fixed period service rate plan at the time it is established. Determination of the revenue commitment for the first year will be calculated by multiplying the customer's current month FRS revenue by 12.
- Must subscribe to a fixed period service rate plan of 36 months or greater for the OMBL FRS and its designated circuits.

• Terms and Conditions:

- Only FRS recurring (whole and partial month) revenues and associated adjustments of these amounts will be used to calculate the annual revenue commitment.
- The FRS Minimum Service Period (MSP) as set forth in 8.3.3.B., preceding, applies. The MSP starts with the installation date of each circuit. Should the customer disconnect the circuit prior to the completion of the MSP of 6 months (PVCs excepted), TLA will apply to the months remaining in the MSP. TLA will not apply beyond the initial 6 month period. (T)
- All new circuits added will be co-terminous with the termination date of the OMBL fixed period service rate plan with which they are associated.

b. Optional Minimum Billing Level (cont'd)

- TLA Threshold

The threshold amount will be determined as follows:

- In the first year of the fixed period service rate plan, the threshold will be 80% of the customer's revenue commitment at the time the OMBL fixed period service rate plan is established.
- For subsequent years of the fixed period service rate plan, the threshold level will be 80% of the previous year's actual revenue, or the threshold of the previous year, whichever is greater.
- For any year the customer's actual revenue falls below the threshold the TLA threshold for the next year will become 80% of the previous year's actual revenue.

- Annual Verification

The OMBL will be validated annually on the anniversary of its establishment date. When the customer's annual revenue exceeds their threshold, TLA will not be assessed. When the customer's annual revenue falls below their threshold, a Shortfall Calculation will be made as follows.

• Shortfall Calculation

In the event the customer's annual revenue falls below the threshold then a TLA will be calculated as follows:

-  $(25\%) \times (\text{Revenue Shortfall (TLA threshold} - \text{actual revenue)}) \times (\text{number of years remaining in the fixed period service rate plan}).$

- Example: Assume a customer has an annual revenue commitment of \$200,000 and a corresponding TLA threshold of \$160,000 (80% of the annual revenue commitment). The OMBL recurring FRS revenue billed for the 3rd year of a 60 month fixed period service rate plan is \$140,000. The TLA would be calculated as follows:

$$(25\%) \times (\$20,000 (\$160,000 - \$140,000)) \times (2) = \$10,000$$

In addition, the TLA threshold for year 4 would be adjusted downward from \$160,000 (80% of \$200,000) to \$112,000 (80% of \$140,000).

###### D. PIC Restoral

When an end user denies requesting a PIC change, the Company shall restore the end user to their previous PIC. All PIC change charges assessed by the Company to the end user as the result of the disputed PIC change shall be credited to the end user service. The IC to which the customer had been presubscribed shall be assessed a PIC Restoral charge as set forth in 13.15.4, following, to restore the customer to their previous PIC.

The PIC Restoral does not include investigation activities performed by the Company. A Letter of Authorization (LOA) from the IC will not be requested or accepted at a later date in the event the charges assessed the IC under the PIC Restoral are disputed.

The PIC Restoral in no way relieves the IC of the F.C.C. requirements for verifying all PIC orders obtained by any telemarketing source prior to submitting those orders to the Company or instituting steps to obtain LOAs on all PIC orders submitted to the Company. In addition, end user customers have the option of initiating a complaint regarding an unauthorized change of PIC to the F.C.C.

###### E. FASTPIC Option

The FASTPIC option enables a PIC to send PIC change orders on residence or business exchange service lines using a WEB based Graphical User Interface (GUI). FASTPIC changes shall be processed within two hours. FASTPIC will be provided for suitably equipped switches. (C)

One FASTPIC charge is assessed per- residence or per- business line that is changed within two hours or less to the interexchange carrier (not to the end user) that submits the PIC change. The PIC change nonrecurring charge, as described in D., preceding, will be continued to be assessed to the end user. If the PIC change is not completed within the two hour limit, the FASTPIC rate is not assessed. Rates are set forth in 13.15.4, following.
