USERS GUIDE

General

This tariff references the National Exchange Carrier Association, Inc., Access Service Tariff F.C.C. No. 5 for its terms and conditions. This tariff contains rates applicable to Interstate Access Services provided within the State of Illinois by the Gridley Telephone Company with the exception of Carrier Common Line and End User Access Service rates. Carrier Common Line and End User Access Service rates are as set forth in National Exchange Carrier Association, Inc., Access Service Tariff F.C.C. No. 5, at 17.1.1 and 17.1.2.

Gridley Telephone Company has filed this tariff in accordance with the F.C.C. Part 61 rules in 47 C.F.R. Section 61.39 as promulgated by the Report and Order in CC Docket No. 86-467, adopted May 14, 1987 and released June 29, 1987. Therefore, this tariff cross references the National Exchange Carrier Association, Inc., Access Service Tariff F.C.C. No. 5 for terms and conditions.

ACCESS SERVICE

1. Application of Tariff

- 1.1 This tariff contains rates and charges applicable to the provision of Switched Access and Special Access Services, and other miscellaneous services, hereinafter referred to collectively as service, provided by the Gridley Telephone Company, hereinafter referred to as the Telephone Company, to customers. This tariff also contains Access Ordering charges that are applicable when these services are ordered or modified by the customer.
- 1.2 The provision of such service by the Telephone Company as set forth in this tariff does not constitute a joint undertaking with the Customer for the furnishing of any service.
- 1.3 Gridley Telephone Company, in accordance with the provisions of Part 61.39(a) of the F.C.C.'s Rules and Regulations, has elected to file its own tariff and reference the regulations, terms and conditions of the National Exchange Carrier Association, Inc. (NECA) Tariff F.C.C. No. 5, Access Service, for the General Regulations, End User Common Line, Carrier Common Line, Switched Access Services, Special Access Services, and other miscellaneous services contained therein. 6. Switched Access Service

The regulations, terms and conditions for Switched Access Service are the same as those set forth in Section 6 of the National Exchange Carrier Association, (NECA) Inc. Access Service Tariff F.C.C. No. 5, except as noted below.

- Section 6.1.3(A)(3) of the National Exchange Carrier Association, (NECA) Inc. Access Service Tariff F.C.C. No. 5 does not apply, and is replaced by the following:

6.1 General (Cont'd)6.1.3 Rate Categories (Cont'd)(A) Local Transport (Cont'd)(3) Tandem Switched Transport

The Tandem Switched Transport rate elements recover a portion of the costs associated with the communications path between the tandem and the end office on circuits that are switched at a tandem switch, and between host and remote switching offices. Tandem Switched Transport consists of circuits dedicated to the use of a single customer from the serving wire center to the tandem and circuits used in common by multiple customers from the tandem to the end office.

Tandem Switched Transport rates consist of a Tandem Switching rate and a Tandem Transport rate.

The Tandem Switching rate recovers a portion of the costs of switching traffic through an access tandem. The Tandem Switching rate specified in Section 17.2.2(G), following, is applied on a per access minute per tandem basis for all originating and all terminating minutes of use switched at the tandem. Tandem locations are identified in NATIONAL EXCHANGE CARRIER ASSOCIATION, INC. TARIFF F.C.C. No. 4, WIRE CENTER INFORMATION.

6. Switched Access Service (Cont'd)6.1 General (Cont'd)6.1.3 Rate Categories (Cont'd)(A) Local Transport (Cont'd)(3) Tandem Switched Transport (Cont'd)

The Tandem Transport rate recovers a portion of the costs of the circuit equipment that is necessary for the termination of each end of the Tandem Switched Transport. The Tandem Transport rate also recovers a portion of the costs of the transmission facilities, including intermediate transmission circuit equipment, between the end points of the interoffice circuits. The Tandem Transport rate specified in Section 17.2.2(G), following, is applied on a per access minute basis (for all originating and terminating minutes of use routed over the facility) for each measured segment of the Tandem Switched Transport (remote office to host office, end office to tandem). This rate applies from host office to remote office, even when Direct Trunking is ordered from the Serving Wire Center to the host office.

The regulations, terms and conditions for Special Access Service are the same as those set forth in Section 7 of the National Exchange Carrier Association, (NECA) Inc. Access Service Tariff F.C.C. No. 5, except as noted below.

- Section 7.10.1 of the National Exchange Carrier Association, (NECA) Inc. Access Service Tariff F.C.C. No. 5 does not apply, and is replaced by the following:

7.10 High Capacity Service7.10.1 Basic Channel Description

A High Capacity channel is a channel for the transmission of nominal 64.0 Kbps*, 128, 256, 384, 512 Kbps or 1.544 Mbps isochronous serial data. The actual bit rate is a function of the channel interface selected by the customer. High Capacity channels are provided between customer designated premises or between a customer designated premises and a Telephone Company hub or hubs.

The customer may provide the Network Channel Terminating Equipment associated with the High Capacity channel at the customer's premises.

A channel with technical specifications package HCl will be capable of an error-free second performance of 98.75% over a continuous 24-hour period as measured at the 1.544 Mbps rate through a CSU equivalent which is designed, manufactured, and maintained to conform with the specifications contained in Technical Reference PUB 62411.

- * Available only as a channel of 1.544 Mbps facility to a Telephone Company Digital Data hub or as a cross connect of two 2.4, 4.8, 9.6, 56.0 or 64.0 Kbps channels of two 1.544 Mbps facilities to a Digital Data hub(s). The customer must provide system and channel assignment data.
