2. Definitions

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(D)

Carrier Identification Code (CIC)

Denotes the numeric code that is assigned by the North American Numbering Plan Association (NANPA) to interexchange carriers for the provisioning of (FGB) and/or (FGD) trunk side Access Service. The four digit numeric code uniquely identifies the IC.

Customer(s)

Denotes any individual, partnership, association, joint-stock company, trust, corporation or government entity or any other entity which subscribes to the services offered under this tariff.

End User

Denotes any customer of an intrastate or interstate carrier, or foreign telecommunications service that is not a carrier, except that a carrier other than a Local Exchange Carrier (LEC) shall be deemed to be an "end user" to the extent that such carrier uses a telecommunication service for administrative purposes, and a person or entity that offers telecommunications services exclusively as a reseller shall be deemed to be an "end user" if all resale transmissions offered by such reseller originate on the premises of such reseller.

Exchange

Denotes a unit, generally smaller than a local access and transport area (LATA), established by the Telephone Company for the administration of communications service in a specified area, which usually embraces a city, town or village and its environs. It consists of one or more central offices together with the associated facilities used in furnishing communications service within that area. One or more designated exchanges comprise a given LATA.

Interexchange Carrier (IC)

Denotes any individual, partnership, association, joint-stock company, trust, governmental entity or corporation engaged for hire in intrastate, interstate or foreign communication by wire or radio, between two or more exchanges.

2. Definitions (Cont'd)

Interstate IntraLATA Telecommunications

Applies to service between points in different states that are in the same LATA.

IntraLATA Service

Applies to service between points that are in the same LATA.

Local Access and Transport Area (LATA)

Denotes a geographic area established for the provision and administration of communications service. It encompasses one or more designated exchanges, which are grouped to serve common social, economic and other purposes.

North American Numbering Plan (NANP)

Denotes a three-digit Numbering Plan Area (NPA) code and a seven-digit telephone number made up of a three-digit Central Office code plus a four-digit station number.

Presubscribed Interexchange Carrier 2 (PIC2)

Denotes an arrangement whereby a customer of the Telephone Company has designated an IC to complete its 1+ and 0+ intraLATA toll calls. This is referred to as a Local Presubscribed Interexchange Carrier (LPIC) for intraLATA toll calls.

Refers to Pacific Bell Telephone Company.

4. Service Description

4.1 General

- A. IntraLATA Wholesale Service (IWS) provides customers the ability to utilize the Telephone Company's network to transmit 1+ Interstate IntraLATA toll calls for their end users over the Telephone Company's network from the Telephone Company's access lines provided to the Telephone Company's end users. - B. The IWS per minute of use rate is assessed per originating completed minute of use for network facilities and unrated toll record. The IWS Service Order Charge will be applied to each Tandem in which an IWS service order is processed by the Telephone Company. The IWS Network Charge will be applied to the initial IWS order to cover the establishment and removal of IWS functionality in all Telephone Company end offices. (T)

4.2 Provisioning

- A. Customers must have a valid CIC to route all 1+ interstate IntraLATA toll traffic including their 0+ Collect and 0+ Billed to Third party IntraLATA calls over the Telephone Company's existing network. 0+ Collect calls and 0+ Billed to Third party IntraLATA calls will route over the Telephone Company's network and be completed by the Telephone Company. The IWS customer will not be charged the MOU for 0+ Collect calls or 0+ Billed to third Party IntraLATA calls as set forth in Schedule 5.2, and the revenue for these calls will be collected by the Telephone Company. The responsibility for notifying the end users about this billing arrangement rest with the IWS customer. Excluded from IWS are casual dialed IntraLATA toll calls (101XXXX+1), Foreign and Home Numbering Plan Area (F/HNPA) 555-1212 IntraLATA, HNPA 555-1212 interLATA and Coin service (1+ Coin Service will not work without Exchange Access Operator Services Signaling and coin control signaling provided by the customer's provider of choice). - B. The Telephone Company will resolve trouble isolated to the Telephone Company's network as reported by the IWS customer, as well as the IWS customer's end users. Such trouble may be reported to designated personnel of the Telephone Company by the IWS customer or their IWS end users. (N)  
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- C. The network announcement heard by a caller will be that of the Telephone Company, not the IWS customer, since the customer uses the Telephone Company's infrastructure including the network announcement. (N)

A. An IWS Order is required when a customer initially orders IWS or when ordering modifications to existing IWS services.

B. IWS is ordered by submitting the "IWS Ordering Form" to the Access Service Center. The customer must purchase IWS for all Telephone Company Tandems within a state when ordering service. The IWS Service Order Charge as specified in Section 5.2 will apply to each Tandem.

A minimum of 30 days written notice to establish service and to disconnect service is required.

5. Rate Regulations

This section contains the specific regulations governing the rates and charges that apply to IWS.

5.1 Rate Elements

A. IWS Rate per Minute of Use

IWS per minute of use rate provides for the use of the Telephone Company's network facilities and unrated toll record and is applied to each completed originating minute of use measured.

B. IWS Service Order Charge

The IWS Service Order Charge is a nonrecurring charge which applies to each service order, per Tandem, processed by the Telephone Company. The customer must purchase IWS for all Telephone Company tandems within a state when ordering service.

C. The IWS Network Charge

The IWS Network Charge is a nonrecurring charge that will be applied to any initial IWS order. This charge covers the establishment and removal of IWS functionality in all Telephone Company end offices for which service is ordered.
