The accompanying tariff material, issued by the Verizon Telephone Companies (Verizon) and bearing Tariff FCC No. 1, Access Service, is sent to you for filing in compliance with the requirements of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended. With this filing, Verizon reinstates the regulations, rates and charges for CyberPOPSM in Tariff F.C.C. No. 1. CyberPOP is a TCP/IP Data Aggregation Service that Verizon mistakenly removed from Tariff F.C.C. No. 1 under Transmittal No. 432.

Verizon offered several TCP/IP Data Aggregation Services under its various access and communications service tariffs until May 1, 2004, the effective date of Transmittal No. 432. TCP/IP Data Aggregation Services utilize modems or routers for the aggregation of traffic bound for the Internet. CyberPOP is a modem based data aggregation service that Verizon offered under its Access Service Tariffs F.C.C. Nos. 1, 11 and 16 and its Facilities for Interstate Access Tariff F.C.C. No. 14. CyberWANTM was a router based data aggregation service that Verizon previously offered under its Communications Service Tariff F.C.C. No. 20 and removed under Transmittal No. 432 since it no longer had any customers subscribing to the service and had no foreseeable demand for the service.

Coincident with the removal of TCP/IP Data Aggregation Services from Tariff F.C.C. No. 20 (Cyber WAN), Verizon also inadvertently removed the regulations, rates and charges for TCP/IP Data Aggregation Service from Tariff F.C.C. No. 1 (CyberPOP). Verizon had assumed that like TCP/IP Data Aggregation Services (CyberWAN) from Tariff F.C.C. No. 20, it no longer had any customers subscribing to TCP/IP Data Aggregation Services (CyberPOP) from Tariff F.C.C. No. 1 and had no foreseeable demand for the service. As a result, Verizon mistakenly removed the regulations, rates and charges for TCP/IP Data Aggregation Service (CyberPOP) from Tariff F.C.C. No. 1 under Transmittal No. 432, which became effective on May 1, 2004. Verizon planned to remove TCP/IP Data Aggregation Services (CyberPOP) from its remaining access service Tariffs F.C.C. Nos. 11, 14 and 16 in a subsequent filing.

Verizon has since realized that it did, and still does, have a customer that aggregates data across the Verizon footprint using TCP/IP Data Aggregation Service (CyberPOP). The Verizon footprint is comprised of the operating territories of Tariffs F.C.C. Nos. 1, 11, 14 and 16. Therefore, Verizon stopped its plans to remove TCP/IP Data Aggregation Service (CyberPOP) from Tariffs F.C.C. Nos. 11, 14 and 16 and must reinstate the TCP/IP Data Aggregation Service (CyberPOP) offering in Tariff F.C.C. No. 1 which was mistakenly removed under Transmittal No. 432. At no time during these filings and their effective dates, was service interrupted for the the TCP/IP Data Aggregation Service (CyberPOP) customer. With this filing, Verizon reinstates the same TCP/IP Data Aggregation Service (CyberPOP) regulations, rates and charges that were in effect under Tariff F.C.C. No. 1 prior to their removal under Transmittal No. 432 on May 1, 2004. The TCP/IP Data Aggregation Service (CyberPOP) regulations, rates and charges reinstated herein originally became effective under Transmittal No. 161 on March 30, 2002.

Support material, to the extent applicable under Section 61.38 of the Commissions Rules was previously submitted under Transmittal No. 161 on March 15, 2002.

This transmittal letter and associated attachments are being filed electronically today via the Federal Communications Commission's Electronic Tariff Filing System (ETFS).
